

## Fundraising Event for Tillamook County Breast Health Coalition Expressions of Hope Silent Auction & Art Sale October 15 & 16

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. On October 15th and 16th, the 5th annual Expressions of Hope Silent Auction and Art Sale to benefit the Breast Health Coalition (BHC) of Tillamook County will be held at Art Space in Bay City. Last year's fundraiser featured decorated theme bras. This year, the focus is on another accessory that many breast cancer survivors add to their wardrobes during treatment -- hats. "We will have various contests for the decorated hats that will be judged by Senator Betsy Johnson," said Suzie Whalen coordinator of the Breast Health Coalition. "We would also like fun, wearable hats to be sold at the silent auction."

The art show will feature art in all mediums many by breast cancer survivors, friends and family and those touched by breast cancer. Survivor stories and photos will be featured as well. Hats and artwork must be brought to Art Space in Bay City on October 14 from noon to 4 pm.

Raffle tickets for the Expressions of Hope Quilt for 2011 are on sale now, six tickets for \$5.00. Please pick up tickets at 2nd Street Market, or Blue Moon Cafe in Tillamook, or the Rinehart Clinic in Wheeler.



All proceeds from this event will benefit the Tillamook Breast Health Coalition, for services to local area breast cancer patients to assist with co-pays, medications, housing, gas for travel to treatments, food and other "extras" not covered by insurance. The BHC provided education and outreach to 1,255 patients from April 2010 to March 2011. "With our resources, we act as a patient navigator, providing support and guidance," said Suzie.

The Expressions of Hope is sponsored by the Samuel S. Johnson Foundation. The art show can be viewed, and bidding begins on October 15th from 9 am to 4 pm, and Sunday, October 16th from 9 am to 2 pm. The judging and Art Show Reception, sponsored by Bank of Astoria will be held from 2 to 4 pm on Sunday, October 16th.

# Valuable Lessons

## *My Dear Community Members,*

Wasn't that a dandy 30 days of summer we finally had? Wow! We were due.

Could you do this? A patient of ours (When I say "ours", I mean yours and mine, because it is your support that makes it possible for us to offer health care services to this man) made the mistake of confronting a person with mental illness earlier this summer. He won't do it again. The other guy attacked him, breaking his jaw in three places. Two months later, he's still in a lot of pain, and on a pureed diet. Here's the amazing thing. When our guy gets out of the hospital, the first thing he does is forgive his attacker. He didn't get an attorney, and he didn't press charges. He told me, "You know, I knew he was mentally ill, and that he couldn't help it. He cried when he found out he had broken my jaw." How good is that? I tell this story because I want you to know the quality of the people your donations support.

Two years ago, I had a patient with an anger management problem in the clinic. He was in a dither, and giving my medical assistant a hard time. Now, I know how to handle these situations, right? I've had the training from international experts; I've been to courses on how to handle angry, possibly dangerous patients. So I march into the exam room and confront him. **Whammo!** Suddenly I'm slammed against the wall, unable to move. The guy is telling me the last time he lost his temper, he did time. I got the message I had missed at one of the trainings. Luckily, the body slam against the wall shook the building, and John Prata, PA extraordinaire, jumped in, and between the two of us, we got the guy back into his chair. The cops showed up promptly, and advised my patient he couldn't be attacking the doctor this way, with which he agreed, and was very apologetic. We finished our visit, with both of us in our respective chairs.

Then it was my turn to apologize, for when I thought about it, it was I who precipitated the attack. I had done everything wrong. You're supposed to get below eye level, assume an open, non-threatening posture, avoid eye contact, speak in a soft voice, ask open-ended questions, etc, not barge in and confront a guy who's about to explode. I still see him, though I've often been asked, "Are you nuts?" "Why?"

So here's why. The presentation was at the MAC Club in Portland, about 15 years ago. It was the very prestigious annual Sommer Memorial Lectures. The doctor discussing how to

handle the angry patient was an Englishman. He was a very funny, entertaining yet a serious physician, it was evident. He had worked with Monty Python, and was skilled in the art of public speaking.

For 98 years, it has been the mission of the Rinehart family to take care of all who walk through the Clinic's doors, and we will strive to continue that tradition.

After he had talked in great detail about how to deal with the angry patient, and there had been several questions from the audience, a doctor stood up near the back of the room, a large room containing about 600 physicians from all over the country, and asked the question, the question that for the rest of our lives every other doctor in that room thanked their lucky stars they hadn't asked:

"Dr.," he said, "How do you discharge a patient from your practice?"

A hush fell over the room. You could have cut the silence with a knife.

Our lecturer recoiled, as if shot in the gut at close range with a magnum. The silence drug on. You could have heard a pin drop, for at least thirty seconds.

After the initial recoil, his expression slowly turned from disbelief, to puzzlement, then anger.

The first "Never" was a barely audible whisper, a hiss. The second we all heard, and it cut to the bone. The third was gentler, not apologizing for the first two, but more civil, more forgiving.

**"Never, never, never** discharge a patient from your practice," he commanded. "There is nothing more devastating you can do to a person, a person who has entrusted you to be his or her physician, than to discharge them from your practice," he continued. "Patients don't recover from being discharged by their physician." "It destroys them," he concluded.

Now he could have said nothing, for that wounded look, and the silence, absolutely thundered through that room. It was one of those moments in life that rocks you to your very being, and gets plastered in your brain in intimate detail, never to be forgotten. I know you know what I mean.

Since that time, I've never told anyone for whom I've accepted care I would no longer be willing to see them, have never discharged anyone from my practice, and I never will. Events have occurred, such as the one above, but none could ever justify rejecting what I have come to know is one of the greatest gifts a person can bestow upon another, the gift of allowing one to be their physician.

Your support allows me to be the physician for all of our community members, such as the ones above, who by their acts of forgiveness teach me how to be a better physician, for all of us.

Your support allows The Rinehart Clinic, and all its providers and personnel, to be here for all of us, in perpetuity, as we have been for the last 98 years. Together, we're doing one heck of a good job. It's a pleasure working with you.
